Welcome back

Our school welcomed all students back to onsite learning after the 4 weeks of learning from home. We were delighted to see their smiling faces coming through the gate this morning, as we have been eagerly anticipating their return to school.

Under the current restrictions, all students will be expected back for face-to-face learning on site. The best learning environment for students is in the classroom therefore teachers will not be supplying 'learning from home' packages. All students should now be at school, at home because they are currently unwell, or at home because they have a medical certificate which states they are unable to attend school due to an ongoing medical condition.

Our school will be vigilant when implementing infection control, physical distancing, and personal hygiene protocols to protect the health and safety of students and staff. Schools will promote the need to follow good hygiene practices like:

- regularly washing hands
- avoiding sharing drinks or food
- coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded immediately
- filling water bottles from bubblers rather than using the bubbler directly.

Only essential visitors will be allowed on site and will be required to check-in and wear a mask at all times.

Parents and carers will need to remain outside of the school grounds and follow physical distancing and avoid gathering for drop-offs and pick-ups.
